



HOMEWORK POLICY

Homework serves an important role in developing good study and work habits in our students.

In general, students can expect to complete some form of homework every night.

Often teachers will ask students to work on projects or assignments at home, and these may be expected to be completed over a number of days. Tasks will be entered in Student Planners, and information for these tasks will often be posted on Google Classroom.

Some subjects have homework books or online programmes like Education Perfect or Maths Buddy. Students may be given specific pages from these books or online tasks to work through for homework.

If no specific homework is set, it is recommended that students revise the work covered in each subject class that day, and make a note if there are any questions they need to ask their teacher in the next lesson - **this is particularly important for senior students**. Time spent reading, either a book for pleasure or a text related to a subject, is also encouraged.

When homework is set, teachers will ensure that homework is entered in Student Planners. Teachers will check to see that homework is done adequately. Parents of Year 7 – 10 students are encouraged to check the planner regularly.
